Lord God,


Help us to remember the sacrifice of the first ANZACs, and the generations of men, women and children who have died in the cause of liberty and peace.

ANZAC Day

ANZAC stands for Australian and New Zealand Army Corps

ANZAC Day - 25 April - is an important national occasion for all Australians and New Zealanders. It marks the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War. The soldiers in those forces quickly became known as ANZACs, and the pride they soon took in that name endures to this day.

ANZAC Day is a day when people throughout Australia and New Zealand commemorate and remember the landing at Gallipoli, Turkey on the 25th of April, 1915.

It is a day when Australians reflect on the many different meanings of war.

THE WORDS OF ATATURK

" Those heroes that shed their blood and lost their lives; You are now lying in the soil of a friendly country.

Therefore rest in peace. There is no difference between the Johnnies and the Mehmets to us where they lie side by side here in this country of ours.

You, the mothers, who sent their sons from far away countries; wipe away your tears; your sons are now lying in our bosom and are in peace.

After having lost their lives on this land they have become our sons as well."
